DEVELOPMENT & PEACE - "RECOVERING TOGETHER!"

Each year on the Fifth Sunday of Lent (Solidarity Sunday), the people of our diocese have always participated generously in the Development & Peace Share Lent collection (*blue envelope in your box sets on Sunday, March 22, there are extra envelopes at the back of the Church or mark an envelope for Share Lent*). Due to the pandemic, we had to postpone the collection. I am writing to express my support for this collection, which Development & Peace – Caritas Canada is calling **COVID-19: Recovering Together**.

The theme of this year's collection, *For Our Common Home*, highlights our interconnectedness with all people and our relationship with the Earth's ecosystems. During the last number of months, I have seen and heard how our parishioners have opened their hearts to the needs of our sisters and brothers throughout our diocese and around the world. We are aware of the suffering people are enduring both locally and globally during this pandemic and have had to reimagine how we might respond.

The people of the Global South are experiencing the harsh effects of the COVID-19 much more so than we are. In the Global South, many people, especially the poor, must travel and work in order to put food on the table. The wide travel and close interactions that day-to-day life requires place many at an elevated risk of catching and transmitting the virus. Our recovery from this pandemic as Catholics in Canada must not exclude those who face the hardest and longest road to recovery elsewhere.

Development & Peace's mission is to serve the poorest and most vulnerable of our world and, as Church with the power of the Holy Spirit, to build God's kingdom of peace and justice. In this great mission, Christ is our hope!

Father Charles Goakery, C.Ss.R. (1931 - 2020)



The Congregation of the Most Holy Redeemer, the Redemptorists in Canada, regret to announce the passing of their brother, Father Charles J. "Bud" Goakery, C.Ss.R., on August 19, 2020, at Victoria Hospital in London ON. "Father Charlie," the eldest son of Charles and Genevieve Goakery, was born in Saint John NB on June 11, 1931. He is predeceased by his late parents and two younger brothers, Robert and Bernard, and survived by his younger sister, Suzanne ("Suzy") Verreau of Edmonton, his late brothers' children, several cousins and a host of good friends and loving parishioners across Canada.

Father Charlie's path to priesthood was not a typical one. At fifty, he was still at home caring for his aging parents and working as a bricklayer and stone mason. Only in 1982, after his father's death, did he begin his Theological Studies. In 1984 he formally entered the Redemptorists and, on September 17, 1988, he was ordained a priest at St. Peter's Church in Saint John NB. In the following years, he served in St. Teresa's Parish (St. John's NL), St. Peter's Parish (Saint John NB), St. Lawrence's Parish (St. Lawrence NL) and several other outport parishes throughout Newfoundland. When he retired from active ministry, he moved to London ON in May 2010, to work and live at St. Patrick's Parish with fellow Redemptorist, Father David Furlonger. As his medical and physical needs became more burdensome, he moved to Queens Village where he lived happily until his admission to Victoria Hospital where he died on August 19.

As a result of the present pandemic, there will be no visitation, but a Funeral Mass will be celebrated for Father Charlie at St. Patrick's Church in London on Monday, August 31 at 11:00 a.m. His remains will then be taken to Toronto for a service with his brother Redemptorists and, from there, to Alberta for a final service and burial in the Redemptorist plot in Edmonton.

Father Charlie was highly-principled, intelligent and hardworking: an accomplished musician, talented artist and gifted preacher sought out by the laity and priests for his down-to-earth advice and gentle wisdom. His jokes, stories and impish grin will be remembered and missed by all who knew him. May God grant him eternal rest.
