### 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of The Congregation of Saint Michael the Archangel



Over half a century ago, a small group of Michaelite Fathers arrived in Windsor Ontario, to minister to the people of Canada. Through the decades that followed several other members of the Congregation have made the journey from Poland to North America to join the original five. Today the North American Vice Province is comprised of 12 members ministering in the Diocese of London, Toronto and Detroit. September 29, 2020 marks the opening of the Centennial Anniversary Year celebrated by the Michaelite Fathers around the world. A special Mass to commemorate this occasion will be celebrated on Tuesday, September 29 at 7:00pm at St. Patrick.

The main celebrant will be Bishop Joseph Dabrowski, CSMA. Welcome.



### 25<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time - September 19/20, 2020

#### Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

When I called the Episcopal Council together for a teleconference last Thursday, 9 September, I asked that they bring to our meeting any concerns from our parishes, especially with respect to the directives for using our churches. One theme that presented itself again and again was the fatigue that was settling in around all the restrictions placed upon parishes. This fatigue is felt by members of pastoral teams and parishioners alike, especially the volunteers who are assisting with registering people for Mass and cleaning our churches.

#### A Word of Thanks to All of You

I would like to thank all who have worked tirelessly throughout the pandemic to continue various forms of pastoral ministry and outreach to the people of our Diocese. The fatigue is affecting us all, but in different and creative ways you have been “the face of the Church” when communities were prevented from gathering, and even now when so many are unable yet to come to our churches to gather with their sisters and brothers.

I know you are doing a lot of work to reschedule celebrations of the sacraments of initiation. I have heard many stories of the support that our parishioners have experienced and of gratitude for their continuing connection with their parishes. Members of pastoral teams have made contact by telephone, email, and through online presentations of Masses, liturgies, reflections, devotions and other prayers. You have truly impacted so many who were or still are confined to their homes.

Our parishes are offering online: lectio divina, daily family rosary, “children’s church”, cooking shows and interviews with local parishioners and community members. They are having virtual gatherings: for Alpha groups, bible studies, small faith sharing groups, sacramental preparation. They are feeding the hungry by providing meals outside. Members of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul continue to serve those in need. Development and Peace groups have been meeting online to promote the year of Laudato si’. Many of you have helped family members when a loved one died, and when no Funeral Mass was possible, you still ministered to them in their grief.

From this list and from many other good works that our parishes are doing, we have “portraits” of how we truly are a church sent forth to proclaim the word of God, to celebrate the sacraments and to exercise the ministry of charity and justice. May God bless all your efforts to bring his love to others!
