



**● Congregation of St. Michael the Archangel - 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary**

The Congregation of St. Michael the Archangel known as The Michaelite Fathers will celebrate the 100<sup>th</sup> Year Jubilee (1921-2021) on **Sunday, September 26, 2021 at 4:00pm at St. Peter's Cathedral** with the Bishops, Priests, Sisters and the faithful of the Michaelite Fathers' parishes.

Due to Covid-19 restrictions we will not be able to invite everyone to the Mass marking the 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary. The Cathedral allows only 116 people and therefore we are bound to this restrictions. There will be NO registration on-line as we previously indicated. Each parish where the Michaelites are ministering is getting only 20 spots. Covid-19 is making it difficult.

That Sunday we will have a Special Celebration of St. Michael at our parishes.

**●The Fourth wave of Covid-19 is on our doorstep** - It is important to remember that we are still in a pandemic and that requirements for **physical distancing, using masks, and maintaining sanitation practices** have not been lessened. "This community needs to do everything it can to keep it at bay. But the single most important thing that we can do is - **get vaccinated!**"

## 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Congregation of St. Michael the Archangel Founder of CSMA: Blessed Father Bronislaw Markiewicz September 29, 1921 - September 29, 2021

Blessed Bronislaw Markiewicz, was born on the 13<sup>th</sup> of July, 1842 in Poland. He was the sixth of the eleven children. In his family home, he received a solid religious formation. During his secondary studies he experienced a certain wavering in the faith. However, he succeeded in overcoming this, and once again finding peace and serenity.

Feeling that God was calling him to the priesthood, he entered the Major Seminary of Przemysl in 1863 and was ordained to the priesthood on September 15, 1867. Following several years of pastoral work, university studies and teaching in the local seminary Bronislaw felt a calling to the religious life. He left for Italy in November 1885 and joined the Salesians where he had the joy of meeting Saint John Bosco before whom he professed religious vows on March 25, 1887. As a Salesian he returned to Poland in 1892. He assumed the assignment of parish priest at Miejsce Piastowe, in Przemysl Diocese.

In addition to his ordinary pastoral activity, Fr. Markiewicz dedicated himself, in the spirit of St. John Bosco, to the formation of poor and orphaned youth. He opened an institute in which he offered his students both material and spiritual support preparing them for life with a professional formation in the schools around the institute itself. Continually striving to do more for them, in 1903 Markiewicz opened a new house in Pawlikowice, near Krakow, where over 400 orphans were given a home where they received spiritual, academic and professional formation.

To carry on his work, he decided to institute a new religious congregations based on the spirituality of St. John Bosco, under the patronage of St. Michael the Archangel. Official Church recognition for the Michaelite Fathers was granted on September 29, 1921 and on August 21, 1958 for the Michaelite Sisters.

Blessed Fr. Bronislaw Markiewicz died on January 29, 1912. Both before and after his death he was considered an extraordinary man. As more people came to know of him and his saintly life, the Superiors of both Religious Communities of St. Michael the Archangel he had established, asked the Bishop of Przemysl to initiate the process of the beatification of their founder.

Fr. Bronislaw Markiewicz was beatified in Warsaw, Poland June 19, 2005.
